

① **book** /bʊk/ *noun* 1. sheets of printed paper attached together, usually with a stiff cover ○ *I'm reading a book on the history of London.* ○ *He wrote a book about butterflies.* 2. sheets of paper attached together □ a book of stamps several stamps inside a small paper cover ○ a set of cardboard maps in a paper cover ○

② **book of** /bʊk ɒf/ *noun* together and ○ *buy a book of books.* Try to vary your reading. We need the dictionary next week. I'll go off to buy all the book some plane tickets you on the to charge the office.

③ **book** /bʊk/ *noun* with shelves ○ **book of** /bʊk ɒf/ *noun* which sells at prices 2. cuss books ○ **booked** /bʊkt/ *verb* or seats reserved ○ **bookie** /'bʊki/ *noun* (informal) ○ **booking** /'bʊkɪŋ/ *noun* to reserve something such as a room or table □ to reserve something such as a table ○ *We tried to make a booking for the week beginning May 1st, but it was full.*

④ **booking office** /'bʊkɪŋ ɒfɪs/ *noun* office in a building such as a cinema, where you can buy tickets

book into /bʊk 'ɪntuː/ *verb* to reserve a room in a hotel □ *I booked into a hotel to reserve a hotel room.* else

bookkeeper /'bʊkkiːpə/ *noun* who keeps the accounts

bookkeeping /'bʊkkiːpɪŋ/ *noun* the activity or job of keeping a record of money

⑤ **booklet** /'bʊklɪt/ *noun* a small book of information (with only a few pages)

brochure /'brʊʃʊrə/ *noun* a small book of information

bookmaker /'bʊkməkiː/ *noun* a person who takes money from people who want to bet on the outcome of a game

bookmark /'bʊkmɑːk/ *noun* 1. something that you put in a book to show the place where you stopped reading 2. the address of a website or web page, stored for easy access

bookseller /'bʊksɛlə/ *noun* a person who sells books, or who runs a bookshop

⑥ **bookshelf** /'bʊkʃɛlf/ *noun* a shelf for books (NOTE: The plural is **bookshelves**)

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bookshop /'bʊkʃɒp/ *noun* a shop where books are sold The US term is **bookstore**

bookmark /'bʊkmɑːk/ *noun* 1. someone who reads a lot 2. a card written on it with the titles of books of that type

bookworm /'bʊkwɜːm/ *noun* 1. someone who reads a lot 2. a person who is very interested in books

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
